Business Breakfast Brings Savvy Operators Together

It was a pleasure to join business owners at the Rosebud Country Club on May 23 for the Mornington Peninsula Business Breakfast.

The breakfast brought nearly 100 likeminded business operators together to network and share ideas.

The Government's focus is on strengthening the overall business environment so that enterprise, large and small, can create more jobs in Australia.

To do this we have locked in a cut in the company tax rate by 1.5 per cent from 1 July 2015.

For up to 800,000 small and medium businesses this will provide a net boost to profitability and competitiveness.

We have also provided \$8 million over four years to transform the existing Office of the Australian Small Business Commissioner into a Small Business and Family Enterprise Ombudsman with additional functions and powers.

The Government has provided \$2.8 million over four years to assist small businesses to access the Commonwealth procurement market. The Department of Finance will work with small businesses to develop procurement policy, guidance material, training and education programmes that make it easier for small businesses to do business with Government.

To help boost tourism, the Government will provide \$43.1 million over four years to implement a new tourism Demand Driver Infrastructure grants programme. The programme will provide funding to the States and Territories for infrastructure projects that encourage international and domestic tourism, which will help small business operators in the tourism space.

Thank you to the Rosebud Country Club for hosting the Mornington Peninsula Business Breakfast and to all the business operators who attended.

What started as a hobby growing Fuchsia baskets in the backyard has expanded to become a thriving business in Somerville.

A desire to be self-employed and a passion for growing plants lead proprietor Eric Haar to establish Haar's Nursery in 1981, to fill a gap in the market for indoor and outdoor flowering plants and foliage.

Haar's Nursery now grows everything from cottage perennials to herbs, vegetables and hanging baskets.

The nursery is a wholesaler to major companies such as Bunnings Warehouse, independent garden centres and landscape designers in Victoria, New South Wales and South Australia.

Haar's Nursery is working on a number of initiatives to improve the business; including reviewing watering procedures and increasing the use of biological treatments on pests to reduce its impact on the environment.

Water Recycling Initiative Key to Growth

Tree Growers Advanced has been part of the Somerville community since 1984.

Peter and Jane Wilkins established the company soon after completing diplomas in Horticultural Science at Burnley Horticultural College.

They identified a gap in the market for semi-advanced plants and set about growing and cultivating plants for major retailers, councils and businesses in Victoria and interstate.

TGA's water recycling system is cutting-edge. Plant beds are on sheeted plastic, covered with screenings to prevent excess water being absorbed into the ground and all runoff water is sent back to a central collection point where it is filtered, disinfected and re-used for irrigation.

TGA has refined this system, which is both environmentally-friendly and a great cost-saving measure for the business.

It is terrific to see local businesses like TGA adopting water-saving and other initiatives to run their business more efficiently while reducing their impact on the environment.

Working Through Internet Issues on Phillip Island

I was disappointed to learn of the internet and telecommunication issues on Phillip Island following the collapse of OneSeniors, OneMobile, CONEC2 and iBoss International.

It has been a frustrating experience for customers associated with these providers.

I met with Steve Murphy from Waterfront Computers about the issue recently. He has been working around the clock to restore internet and phone connection for his customers.

The Government has been consulting with industry body the Communications Alliance, which is conducting an inquiry into the matter.

Loss at the Heart of Cheese Sensation

After losing her 14-year-old son Reagan in a scuba diving accident, Tamara Newing found comfort in making cheese.

She feels closest to her son when making cheese and it has become a very important part of her life.

As the business developed, she turned the old boatshed storage area beneath her Mt Martha home into a fully-equipped cheese-making facility – and so Boatshed Cheese was formed.

What was originally a coping mechanism for Tamara, has now turned into a full-scale business, to the point where she is about to take on an apprentice cheesemaker.

Tamara is an inspiration. Her courage and strength in the face of adversity is outstanding and in tasting her cheese you really get a sense of the love and passion she puts into it.

Boatshed Cheese supplies handmade, artisan cheese to many restaurants throughout the Mornington Peninsula.

Tamara has won numerous awards for her cheese, including "Best Australian Goat Cheese" at the 2013 Dairy Industry Awards Australia for her Black Pearl cheese, 2013 "Best International Cheese" at the North Carolina State Fair for her Chelsea Blue cheese and 2014 "Champion Cheese" at the Royal Queensland Dairy Award for her Pure Goat Curd. Her Persian Fetta is a current finalist in the 2014 Delicious Magazine Taste Awards.
