Funding for youth mental health services

I am delighted that we have been able to deliver on our election commitment of \$240,000 in funding for Frankston headspace, ensuring vital mental health services are available to young people on the **Mornington Peninsula** on an ongoing basis.

A total of \$750,000 will fund youth mental health services from St Kilda to the Mornington Peninsula, through the South Eastern Melbourne Primary Health Network - delivering on a key election commitment. Mental health is a key priority for the me and deep personal priority. This funding will help improve the lives of many young people and their families, across the Mornington Peninsula.

Frankston headspace is now developing and trialing new initiatives to tackle severe youth mental health issues, including hiring trained youth workers to engage with young people and connect them with the right service.

\$6 million for access to MRI for the Mornington Peninsula

For the first time, patients on the **Mornington Peninsula** have full access to bulk billing for Frankston Hospital's MRI (Magnetic Resonance Imaging) service.

This service will benefit 2,000 patients every year, who are now able to access the MRI service as bulk-billed Medicare patients.

MRI is a diagnostic tool that is best practice for the diagnosis of many cancers, neurological

disorders and orthopaedic soft tissue injuries and is regarded as the 'front line' tool in the diagnosis of breast cancer and cardiac anomalies

This \$6 million investment over the forward Budget will make an enormous difference to patients on the Mornington Peninsula by reducing waiting periods to access this vital service.

Great Peninsula Paddle raises vital funds for disadvantaged youth in Hastings

I was delighted that my first event as Minister for Sport was participating in the Reclink Great Peninsula Paddle at Sorrento Sailing Couta Boat Club on Australia Day.

Reclink is a fantastic organisation and the \$5,600 raised through this year's Peninsula Paddle will support the re-establishment of the Western Port Warriors Football Team, which assists disadvantaged youth in the Hastings and Somerville areas to participate and enjoy the benefits of sport.

I would like to thank all of the volunteers and participants who took part in the Great Peninsula Paddle. I look forward to seeing you all again next year.

Federal Government backing our local wine industry

Mornington Peninsula winemakers, particularly Crittenden's, Paringa, Foxey's and Port Phillip Estate, have been influential in the development of enhanced changes to the Federal Government's Wine Equalisation Tax (WET) Rebate.

The changes will better assist grape growing, winemaking, associated tourism and local jobs in regional Australia, including here on the Peninsula.

The Government has also announced a new Wine Tourism and Cellar Door grant scheme to provide up to \$100,000 per annum to producers who exceed the \$350,000 Rebate cap.

We have listened carefully to Mornington Peninsula winemakers and tailored a national package so that the wine producers who build brands, invest in regional communities and create local jobs are the beneficiaries of the Rebate.

Interim safety measures accelerated for Forest Drive

After months of negotiations, I am pleased VicRoads has confirmed its commitment to improving safety at the dangerous Forest Drive intersection in **Mount Martha** thanks to \$200,000 in Federal Government funding.

At the last election, I assured residents that we would make this intersection safer for pedestrians, cyclists and motorists.


Victorian Minister for Roads Luke Donnellan has now confirmed the Federal funds will be used to install interim safety measures at this horrendous intersection.

I share the concerns of local residents following a fatality and several near misses at this site and am relieved that this funding will ensure the community's safety.

New buildings for Somerville, Mount Martha and Crib Point Schools

The Federal Government is investing in local independent schools to provide students with top-class facilities to ensure they succeed in a competitive world.

Balcombe Grammar School in **Mount Martha** has received \$2 million for a new VCE centre, while St Joseph's Primary School in **Crib Point** and St Brendan's Primary School in **Somerville** have received more than \$1.2 million each for new classrooms.



Mornington Peninsula Junior Football League kicking goals

I was thrilled to visit BlueScope Reserve in **Hastings** to see upgrades completed through the Federal Government's Stronger Communities Program.

Mornington Peninsula Junior Football League (MPJFL) received \$9,519 to install infield irrigation, which has improved the playing surface and made it safer for all users.

The oval is used by a number of local sporting groups and schools in Hastings and the surrounding area.

MPJFL was one of nine local groups that received funding under Round Two of the Stronger Communities Program.

Infrastructure package improves road safety

We are making roads safer and reducing congestion for all road users. Projects include:

- \$500 million Commonwealth Government contribution towards the Monash Freeway widening
- \$275,000 upgrade to the intersection of Woolamai Beach Road and Phillip Island Tourist Road at Cape Woolamai

These vital upgrades will improve road safety as we work towards a more efficient and safer transport network for all users.

Men's Sheds support for Cranbourne and Mount Martha

Local Men's Sheds are receiving a Federal funding boost to assist with the cost of new equipment and training.

Cranbourne Casey Men's Shed will receive \$4500 and the New Peninsula Men's Shed in **Mount Martha** will receive \$5000 to promote and support men's health and wellbeing.

Men's Sheds are a popular way for men to connect with their community, whether it's through a building project, a first aid workshop or a transition to retirement seminar.

The grants support the purchase of tools, equipment, community projects, training, building maintenance and health improvement activities.

Hastings Hub gets solar panels

The College has already noticed a drop in electricity prices and is feeding back to the grid.

Founded by Lanie Muir, the business employs people suffering from a range of mental health issues. By assisting these people into employment it provides a sense of hope for their future by reducing some of the usual barriers they may come up against.

I am delighted to announce that the tender process for the new **Phillip Island** Health and Medical Hub is currently underway.

At the completion of this process, the final \$2 million Federal Government contribution will be transferred to Victoria for the completion of the Hub at Cowes.

Construction is expected to commence soon and is due for completion in March 2018.

The Hub will provide a range of new health and medical services in a state-of-the-art building. More importantly, it will become part of the Wonthaggi Hospital network and will expand as the demand for health services increases.

I will continue to work with the community and the Victorian Government to deliver additional services.

The 1066 Hastings Day Club has received a grant of \$6,285 to allow members to take part in a series of bus trips and activities in order to help reduce social isolation.


By providing funding to local organisations through the Veteran and Community Grants program, the Turnbull Government is helping improve the lives of veterans, their families and local communities.

Inspiring girls to get active

We are taking action to inspire more Australian women and young girls to get active with the Girls Make Your Move campaign.

The \$7 million second phase of the campaign includes advertising across social media, television and cinema with the aim of getting more girls aged 12 to 19 involved in sport.

The Girls Make Your Move Instagram and Facebook pages have daily tips and motivational messages to inspire young women to keep active.

I hope this encourages girls to get out and participate in a sport or activity of their own.

Making more cancer drugs affordable for all Australians

During Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month in February, I was pleased to announce subsidised access to new ovarian and lung cancer drugs.

These drugs, which would otherwise cost more than \$100,000 per course of treatment, are now available for just \$6.30 for concessional patients and \$38.80 for general patients.

Olaparib is used in the treatment of high grade serous ovarian, fallopian, and peritoneal cancers and works by programming the destruction of cancerous cells. Ceritinib, is used in the treatment of non-small cell lung cancer and has been shown to inhibit cell proliferation, leading to a regression of tumours.

Listing these two cancer drugs on the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme is expected to benefit more than 357 Australians per year, over six years, improving quality of life and significantly extending life expectancy.
