Helping small businesses grow



The right choices to grow small businesses

A strong small business sector means more jobs for Australians and more opportunities to build vibrant local communities across the country.

The Turnbull Government is extending tax cuts for small and medium-sized businesses with a turnover of less than \$25 million per annum this year.

Incorporated small businesses with a turnover less than \$10 million will have their tax rate cut to 27.5 per cent in 2016-17, the lowest level in 50 years.

The Turnbull Government will further commit to reducing red tape by providing up to \$300 million to States and Territories that remove regulatory barriers.

David Hilet from Galaxy Print and Design in Hastings is one of the 3.2 million small businesses across Australia benefitting from these tax cuts.

Together, these businesses employ more than 5.6 million people.

Extension of the instant asset write-off

The 2017 Budget extends the \$20,000 instant asset write-off for a further 12 months to 30 June 2018. The turnover threshold will also be lifted to \$10 million.

This measure will improve cash flow for small businesses, helping them to reinvest in their business and replace or upgrade assets.

Improved cash flow will give businesses the flexibility to hire more employees and pay staff more.

Innovation the key to next generation manufacturing



\$1 million for Somerville-based manufacturer

Somerville-based manufacturing company Sealite has received a \$1 million grant through the Turnbull Government's \$90 million Next Generation Manufacturing Investment Programme.

Sealite will put the grant towards a \$10.5 million project to establish a new Advanced Manufacturing and Innovation Centre for specialist marine navigation aids and aviation ground lighting systems.

The Next Generation Manufacturing Investment Programme will deliver strong economic benefits to South Australia and Victoria by encouraging investment in technologically innovative, advanced manufacturing processes and creating more than 500 jobs between the two states.

This is a great opportunity for Sealite to invest in its future by boosting its advanced manufacturing capability, which in turn creates jobs and increases its ability to compete on the global stage.

The Next Generation Manufacturing Investment Programme is a key part of the Australian Government's \$155 million Growth Fund to assist employees, businesses and regions affected by the closure of Australia's car manufacturing industry.

Australian Fresh Leaf Herbs

Clyde-based business Australian Fresh Leaf Herbs has gone from strength to strength since opening nine years ago.

The horticulture company uses the latest technology to grow herbs more sustainably while providing nutritious edible plants for home cooks, professional chefs and health-conscious consumers.

Since it was established in 2008, the business has gone from producing 2,000 bunches of herbs with two employees to current peak productions of 180,000 units per week with more than 50 employees from the local area.

Founding partner Jan Vydra is passionate about innovation in the agricultural industry and was awarded a Nuffield Scholarship in 2016, which allowed him to travel the world meeting farmers and industry experts in the agricultural sector.

Jan's study topic, 'more food, less earth', examined the great challenge humanity faces in ensuring enough food is produced to sustain a ballooning global population over the next five years.

Fresh Leaf Herbs' innovative growing practices are impressive and their ideas for diversifying and growing the business won them a 2016 Casey Cardinia Business of the Year award.

Supporting employers who hire jobseekers



New support for youth jobs

New Federal Government incentives are available to help local young people find employment.

The changes will provide incentive payments of \$1,000 to local businesses to encourage them to take on more young people.

Job seekers participating in the scheme will receive a \$200 fortnightly payment on top of their income support payments when carrying out a voluntary internship.

These changes are a key component of the Turnbull Government's Youth Jobs (Prepare, Trial, Hire) PaTH Program, which will help job seekers under 25 years.

The Program will help 120,000 vulnerable young Australians over four years through pre-employment training, internships and wage subsidies for employers.

Financial incentives of up to \$10,000 are available to employers who employ eligible young job seekers.

This will help our local economy and create more jobs.
