Like many local residents, I was dismayed by beach closures and water quality issues around Port Phillip Bay over summer.

In an effort to tackle this problem head on, with local groups I have initiated a 10-year campaign to Clean Up Port Phillip Bay.

The campaign was launched in conjunction with the Committee for Melbourne and I am delighted that some of Melbourne's best-known institutions have now joined the fight.

Together we aim to make Port Phillip Bay the cleanest urban waterway in the Southern Hemisphere by 2022.

The Bay is recognised as one of Melbourne's most wonderful assets but the water quality can be poor with significant consequences for the health of the ecosystem and marine wildlife inhabiting the Bay.

It is disappointing that in recent months high pollution levels have meant that many of our most popular beaches have been closed.

The newly-formed Clean Up the Bay Partnership aims to work closely with the Victorian Government in galvanising community action and pride in the Bay.

The Clean Up the Bay Partnership is headed by marine educator and author Sheree Marris and former Prime Minister's Environmentalist of the Year, Arron Wood.

Other organisations involved include the City of Melbourne, Environment Victoria, the Dolphin Research Institute, University of Melbourne, Museum Victoria, Association of Bayside Municipalities, Life Saving Victoria, Yachting Victoria, the Boating Industry Association of Victoria, Transfield Services and Humes.

New Police Station for Koo Wee Rup

Koo Wee Rup has much to celebrate with plans for an urgently-needed truck bypass well underway and the recent opening of a new purpose-built police station.

Congratulations to Bass MP Ken Smith and all who helped fight for the station.

While the new police facility at Koo Wee Rup is very welcome, there is still an urgent need for the **Lang Lang** police station to be re-opened on a permanent basis.

Together with the Lang Lang community, I will continue to fight for the reinstatement of the town's police officer.

Success for Somerville

It brings me great satisfaction to see two long-running community campaigns coming to fruition in **Somerville**.

The fight to secure a secondary college for Somerville began a decade ago when the then state Labor government wanted to sell the land and take away the prospect of a school forever.

As a community we fought for the land to be retained and then fought for the establishment of a Year 7-10 college as a campus of Mt Erin Secondary.

The third step in the campaign was an independent Year 7-10 school. Finally, this year, a fully autonomous Year 7-12 secondary college was established.

Somerville Secondary College offers an impressive Year 12 program, giving local young people every opportunity to build a rewarding and fulfilling career.

The next and final step will be the creation of a technical education centre in the grounds of the college.

Another Somerville community campaign - for a police station - has also been a success. (See story on the opposite page).


Mt Martha on the Move

I am now working closely with the Mt Martha Life Saving Club - one of the largest clubs on Port Phillip Bay - on plans for a new clubhouse.

After 500km and 19 days, I was delighted to finally reach the end of my *Walk for Autism* last year.

And it was my great pleasure to be able to present Abacus Learning Centre in **Hastings** and Autism Victoria with cheques totalling \$35,864.

Close to 400 people joined the various stages of the walk, which began at **Arthurs Seat** and finished at **Cowes** on Phillip Island.

I was particularly delighted to be joined by two local mums, Natalie and Marilyn, who each walked hundreds of kilometres.

During the course of the walk we visited a total of 56 schools to raise awareness of autism and talk to students about how they could be a friend to someone with autism.

Donations came from local residents, schools, pre-schools, businesses, service clubs, sporting clubs and philanthropic organisations. My heartfelt thanks go to all those who donated.

The next step in the ongoing campaign for better autism support will be the tabling of a motion in Parliament calling for the creation of a National Autism Summit to discuss how best we can support families living with autism.

Crib Point Celebrates

After a two-year fight, **Crib Point** residents have breathed a sigh of relief with the news that a planned bitumen plant will not now go ahead.

This means that Crib Point will not now be re-industrialised but instead preserved as a residential area.

The Crib Point Advisory Group, and in particular Rosemary Evans, did a fantastic job of galvanising local opposition to the bitumen plant plan.

Somerville Police Station

The fight for a police station at **Somerville** was a long and protracted one and I am delighted that the Baillieu Government has begun the process of searching for an appropriate parcel of land on which to build the facility.

I am pleased to have worked with Hastings MP Neale Burgess, as well as a band of dedicated local residents, on securing this outcome for Somerville.

It now seems likely that the new facility will not only offer 24-hour local police coverage, it will also house some of the district functions with an additional police capacity.

A Boost for Hastings

Recent job loses caused by the closure of BlueScope Steel's hot strip mill at **Hastings** have been a significant blow to the Western Port community.

Our immediate fight was to secure financial support not only for the BlueScope workers but for workers from surrounding businesses who also lost their jobs as a result of the closure.

I also met with the Prime Minister's office to push strongly for extra funding for jobs creation in Western Port similar to that given to the Illawarra region, where BlueScope also laid off workers.

I am pleased to report that \$2 million in extra funding to stimulate jobs and training in Western Port has recently been made available. My office is now working with local community and employment organisations on identifying potential projects to be funded.

A New Health Facility for Phillip Island



I met recently with Bass Coast Regional Health chief Lea Pope as well as representatives of the Bass Coast Community Health Service and local residents to discuss plans for a new health facility at **Cowes**.

A proposal to combine hospital services such as palliative care, dialysis and specialist consulting rooms with a range of community health services and a GP clinic in a new purposebuilt facility has been submitted to the Federal Government for funding.

The vision we are pursuing would see the health facility developed in a way that would allow for additional services to be added over time, with the ultimate aim of having a hospital on the island once more.

The proposal has been shortlisted for funding. We are hopeful of securing funding soon to begin work on this much-needed new facility.

Inadequate Internet Connections

Many residents in the Peninsula Sands estate at **Rosebud** and at **Botanic Ridge** have contacted me reporting problems in getting access to the internet.

Each time I approach the Government with this issue the answer is the same: residents must wait for up to 10 years or more until the NBN is rolled out on the Peninsula, if at all.

This is completely unacceptable and I will continue to fight for a better deal for the electorate. In the meantime, I ask all local residents experiencing trouble in accessing the internet to join the campaign by contacting my office on 5979 3188.
