17 LOCAL SCHOOLS IN FLINDERS ELECTORATE TO RECEIVE A TOTAL OF \$1,863,056

Greg recently announced that the Australian Government's *Investing in our Schools* Initiative will deliver over \$1.8 million to 17 local schools within the electorate of Flinders. This comes on top of an additional 20 grants which have previously been announced for local schools.

Local schools that will benefit include:



NATIONAL DO NOT CALL REGISTER

Greg was delighted to announce that residents and small businesses in the Flinders electorate will be protected from nuisance telemarketing phone calls with the creation of a national, legislated Do Not Call Register, by the Federal Government.

Individuals and small businesses will not be required to pay a fee for registering their telephone numbers. The register is expected to commence operating in 2007.

SENIORS

Over 20,000 Seniors in Flinders will benefit from the following:

- A one-off payment of \$102.80 will be provided by 30 June 2006 to each household eligible for the Utilities Allowance and to each selffunded retiree eligible for the Seniors Concession Allowance.
- Eligibility for the Utilities Allowance and the one-off payment is being extended to Mature Age Allowance, Partner Allowance and Widow Allowance recipients.
- Exclusion of the family farm from pension tests for around 100 retired farmers and rural landholders.
- The Government has announced a plan to dramatically simplify and streamline superannuation, including tax free superannuation benefits for people aged 60 and over who are paid from a taxed fund from 1 July 2007.

LOCAL ROADS

On 30 June 2006, local Councils within the Electorate of Flinders will receive further funding:

FAMILIES

Over 2,000 families in the Flinders electorate will benefit from items including the following:

- ✓ Eligibility for the maximum rate of Family Tax Benefit Part A is being extended to families with an annual income of up to \$40,000 (currently \$33,361) from 1 July 2006. Around 2,500 families are expected to benefit with an average increase of \$9.60 per fortnight.
- Around 3,000 families with three children will also benefit by \$248 a year when the number of children required to get the Large Family Supplement is reduced from four to three children from 1 July 2006.
- Grade 3 students who have not met the 2006 national minimum reading benchmark will be eligible for \$700 worth of reading tuition and support. Individual one-on-one tuition will be arranged by working with schools in partnership with parents and the programme will operate during 2007.
- 99% of Childcare places will now be uncapped, so that demand can be met where and when it occurs. This is a great opportunity for local schools.

CARERS

Payment of one-off carer bonus:

- Around 700 recipients of the Carer Payment will receive a \$1,000 one-off bonus by 30 June 2006.
- Around 2,600 recipients of the Carer Allowance will receive a \$600 one-off bonus by 30 June 2006.

Budget delivers results for the **Electorate** ••••

TAX RELIEF

Tax Relief from the 1 July 2006 for 100% of taxpayers in the Flinders electorate:

The budget will provide taxpayers with personal tax cuts worth \$36.7 billion over four years from 1 July 2006.

- ✓ The 30 per cent threshold will rise to \$25,001.
- ✓ The 42 percent marginal tax rate will be cut to 40 percent and the threshold will rise to \$75,001.
- ✓ The 47 percent marginal tax rate will be cut to 45 per cent and the threshold will rise to \$150,001.
- ✓ The low income tax offset will increase from \$235 to \$600 per year and will begin to phase out from \$25,000, up from \$21,600. There will now be no net tax for low income earners earning under \$10,000.

SMALL BUSINESS

- The Wine Equalisation Tax (WET) rebate will now apply to sales of up to \$1.7m, up from \$1.0 m previously, helping over 15 local small businesses.
- ✓ The Budget encourages business to play their part in building for Australia's future. By increasing the diminishing value rate for depreciation from 150% to 200% for eligible assets, businesses, will be able to write off the cost of new plant and equipment more rapidly and therefore, have more incentive to invest.

FOR HERITAGE AND A NATIONAL CENTRE FOR MARINE AND COASTAL CONSERVATION ON THE MORNINGTON PENINSULA

Greg is delighted to announce that the Mornington Peninsula will receive an extra **\$27 Million from the 2006-07 Budget to help** the Point Nepean Community Trust and the Australian Maritime College **establish the** *National Centre for Marine and Coastal Conservation* and to refurbish the Heritage Buildings at Point Nepean.

This takes the total Australian Government funding for heritage and the creation of the Southern Peninsula's first tertiary institution to offer degrees — the Australian Maritime College's National Centre for Marine and Coastal Conservation — to almost \$48m.

Greg worked directly with the Prime Minister and Treasurer to secure this funding and is pleased that the local community will now have an opportunity to study and participate in a world-class educational facility, heritage and community precinct and National Park. Primary, secondary and tertiary students will all be able to, and have begun, to study marine education on the Mornington Peninsula.

\$2,333,100 in Commonwealth Government funding will go to Black Spot projects in Flinders:

\$534,000	Graydens Road from Stumpy Gully Road to Loders Road, Moorooduc: Seal shoulders and provide skid resistance asphalt on curve
\$401,000	Eramosa Road East (from Almond Bush Street to Western Port Highway), Somerville: Seal shoulders, delineation and upgrade guardrail
\$389,000	Eramosa Road East and Lower Somerville Road, Somerville: Installation of a

roundabout
\$381,100 Craigie Road and Racecourse Road,

The mangroves are being planted because the bare mudflats, which were once covered with flourishing seagrass, are now covered with a sticky mud from the eroding low cliffs preventing the seagrass from growing.

During Greg's visit the **thousandth** seedling was planted. Greg commended Dr Ealey and the volunteers on the fantastic work they're doing for the local community, the future of Western Port Bay and the local environment.
