I am therefore delighted that we have been able to successfully secure funding for school projects including:

- \$1.85 million for Dromana Secondary College
- \$150,000 for Cranbourne Christian College
- \$250,000 for Hillcrest Christian College
- \$600,000 for the Peninsula Special School

I am also pleased that we have achieved many other educational outcomes including:

- Working with Neale Burgess to establish a literacy support program at West Park Primary in Hastings.
- Helping in the successful campaign for a Secondary College in Somerville.
- Assisting at Chisholm Institute in Rosebud with long term planning for students from Rosebud, Dromana and Rye.
- Working with local State Member, Ken Smith MLC, towards the establishment of an IT skills centre for Phillip Island, San Remo, Corinella and Grantville.

WORKING TO REVEGETATE PARKLAND IN MT MARTHA

Greg recently worked with participants across all age groups to help revegetate parkland in Mt Martha opposite the Mt Martha Primary School.

BUILDING A BETTER LOCAL TRANSPORT SYSTEM.

Improving safety on our local roads is a top priority for local residents. That is why Greg has been working closely with his state colleagues Ken Smith MLC, Neale Burgess, and Martin Dixon MLA, to successfully upgrade our community's busiest and most important highways and public transport systems:

Bass Coast Highway Upgrade

Secured \$350,000 to improve road safety on Bass Highway from Anderson Road to Wonthaggi, through the installation of guideposts, signs and line markings.

Ken Smith has fought for many years for this upgrade which will greatly improve safety on an unnecessarily dangerous stretch of road.

Hastings-Dandenong Road Upgrade

✓ Secured \$500,000 for a road safety project to improve Hastings-Dandenong Road through resurfacing and the sealing of shoulders.

This upgrade is an addition to Greg's successful fight along with Neale Burgess, Robin Cooper MLA, John Antoine and local residents, for the soon to be completed roundabout at the Hastings-Dandenong Road and Frankston-Flinders Road intersection.

Peninsula bus system Upgrade

✓ Worked with Martin Dixon to help win \$500,000 upgrade of the bus service to Dromana, Rosebud, McCrae, Tootgarook, Rye, Blairgowrie and Sorrento.

DELIVERING NEW REGIONAL HEALTH SERVICE FOR SAN REMO & DISTRICT

A range of new health services will now be provided by the San Remo and District Community Health Centre to San Remo, Phillip Island, Grantville, Corinella and Coronet Bay thanks to the Federal Government's Regional Health Services Program.

Delivering up to \$529,129 over the next three years, the Federal program will help fund a broad range of services including physiotherapy, podiatry, health promotion, nursing advice, home visits (including medication supervision and administration) and health counselling.

WORKING TO BUILD A SECOND PHARMACY IN SOMERVILLE

A NATIONAL STRATEGY TO END ALL OCEAN OUTFALLS



As part of the fight to clean up Gunnamatta Beach Greg has taken the issue of Ocean Outfalls to Canberra. In a recent letter to the Prime Minister Greg secured the support of Federal Parliamentarians from every state and territory for a 20 year plan to end ocean outfall not just at Gunnamatta beach but throughout all of Australia.

Water is far too precious a resource to waste, especially with Australia facing one of the worst droughts on record.

Greg is working with State MP Martin Dixon and the Clean Ocean Foundation to protect our environment so that local children can enjoy our beaches whilst also saving water for drought ravaged farmers.

IMPROVED SERVICES AT ROSEBUD HOSPITAL

Greg is delighted that the community has been successful in securing additional medical support to keep Rosebud Emergency Services open 24 hours a day.

A major \$500,000 upgrade to the Hospital's emergency services ward is also being undertaken, thanks in no small part to the hard work of local State Member Martin Dixon MLA.

The upgrade will include a new state of the art patient monitoring system and it is expected that the upgrade will be completed by Christmas.

Greg was particularly pleased at the result as this was one of the core issues that he promised to fight for during the last election.

FIGHTING TO HAVE THE PENINSULA INCLUDED IN THE METROPOLITAN LOCAL CALL ZONE

In response to calls from local residents, Greg Hunt and neighbouring Federal MP Bruce Billson recently launched an Outer Metropolitan initiative aimed at convincing Telstra to extend the metropolitan call zone to the entire Mornington Peninsula.

In addition, Greg and Bruce are pushing to have Broadband access extended throughout the Peninsula.

As a local resident Greg understands the cost and importance of affordable communications with the city for both small business and local retirees.



In honour of her achievements, Mr Hunt presented Mrs Doueal with a Flinders Community Contribution Award.

Similarly, Philip Mangle of Rosebud, recently won the prestigious Plate Event, in the Mens 45-50 year age group at the World Masters Tournament and is affectionately known as 'The Mangler' for his hard hitting ability.

Tom Steward is currently the Rosebud and Victorian Under 15 State Champion and is one of Australia's most promising juniors.

KEEPING HOUSING OFF PT NEPEAN

Greg is delighted at the progress that is being made on the fight to save Point Nepean from housing. Along with state colleague Martin Dixon, Greg remains resolutely opposed to housing on Point Nepean.

In order to achieve that outcome the Community Reference Group is currently examining viable non-housing options based on the principle of:

- No housing
- Preservation of the bush land
- Retention of public ownership whether by trust or Government
- Constructive use of the Norris Barracks area for publicly beneficial outcomes such as heritage, conferencing and accommodation, and education

The Community Reference Group led by David Stewart, Peter MacNamara and Ian Haskins should be congratulated on the extraordinary energy they are investing to keep housing off Point Nepean. My hope is that the State Government will reverse its position and agree to be an active part of the process.

LOCAL SQUASH CHAMPIONS HONOURED

Greg recently visited the Rosebud International Squash Centre to congratulate Rosebud squash stars Margaret Doueal, Philip Mangle and Tom Steward.

Mrs Doueal, who lives in Rosebud took up squash comparatively late in life, at 33 and has just won the World Masters Squash Championships in the 65 - 70 age group.

RYE PIER SNORKELLING TRAIL OPENS

Greg recently attended the opening of the Rye Pier Snorkelling Trail. The trail, was conceived and designed by Young Victorian of the Year Sheree Maris and is the first underwater marine trail of its kind in Victoria. 

BURGESS AND HUNT COMMIT TO HASTINGS SUBMARINE

Following a recent working visit to the Hastings submarine, Greg Hunt and State colleague Neale Burgess expressed their rock solid commitment to the Hastings submarine project.

Greg stated: "It is estimated that the project will bring over \$4.5 million to Hastings each year. I am delighted that my state colleague Neale Burgess has the same commitment to the project and to the self less work of the Oberon Association."

Neale Burgess described the submarine as: "A magnificent educational project, which will help complete the opening of the foreshore environment and which will build on the new aquatic centre.

The sub will be a source of real pride for the people of Hastings and Crib Point, particularly as it will bring jobs by focussing on education and environmentally friendly tourism. I hope we can have bi-partisan support for this great community project."

DELIVERING A SOMERVILLE SECONDARY COLLEGE

Thanks to the hard work of local members of the community, such as Phil Brake and Neale Burgess, the battle for a Somerville Secondary College has finally been won.

The Somerville College will:

- Provide first class education, in Somerville, for our children;
- Provide a safe and supervised environment for our children both during and after school;
- End long trips to school for Somerville and Tyabb families;
- Become a centre for community life; and
- Inject a \$9 million investment into the Somerville, Baxter and Tyabb communities

The college will open in January 2005, initially for year 7 and 8 students.

VOLUNTEERS SOUGHT TO HELP CLEAN UP GRAFFITI AT CRIB POINT SHOPS

Greg Hunt is working with Neale Burgess and other interested members of the local community to find a solution to the graffiti problem at the Disney Street shops in Crib Point.

Graffiti makes the area appear unsafe and discourages members of the community from visiting the area and supporting local businesses.

As a first step Greg is calling on volunteers to assist in the clean up. Anyone interested in helping should call Greg's office.

Participants of Work for the Dole programs have found that they not only benefited personally by developing new skills but were also able to make a valuable contribution to the community.

In Cranbourne and with the assistance of 30 Work for the Dole students, Recruitnet has successfully converted 2000 broken down computers into 600 fully operational ones that were donated back to the community.

Ken Smith & Greg Hunt Fighting to deliver natural gas to Phillip Island

I am committed to working with my state colleague Ken Smith to fight to have natural gas piped to homes and businesses in Phillip Island and San Remo.

The availability of natural gas could lead to the creation of many new local jobs as existing businesses expand and new businesses are attracted to the region.

Natural gas would also save our local hospitals and aged care centres, such as Melaleuca Lodge Hostel, thousands of dollars from their energy bills.

The Federal Government will provide \$105,000 for a gas reticulation study for Bass Coast and Gippsland and the State Opposition has pledged a 5 year \$30 million gas reticulation program for rural Victoria.

GRANTVILLE AND LANG LANG COMMUNITY CENTRES CLOSER TO OPENING

Along with the relevant shire councils, Greg Hunt recently made a strong push to win support for Rural Transaction Centre funding for both Lang Lang and Grantville. These transaction centres would double as community centres.

In Lang Lang this would add to progress already made on state funding for a community medical centre.

In Grantville, Greg has been working with local State MP Ken Smith to ensure that this is one of the first projects approved when the Federal Government announces its next round of funding.

KOO WEE RUP SENIOR CITIZENS OBTAIN TAX EXEMPTION FOR BUILDING PROJECT

Greg recently helped the Koo Wee Rup Senior Citizens Club obtain a tax exemption for a building project that will greatly improve the local Senior Citizens Centre.

FIGHTING FOR AUSTRALIAN JOBS ON PHILLIP ISLAND


To protect local jobs, Greg Hunt has taken up Sherlock's case with major retailer Bunnings seeking a fair go for Sherlock.
