#### GUNNAMATTA HELPS CREATE A NATIONAL PROGRAM TO CLEAN-UP OUR BEACHES AND WATERWAYS

If Australia is to grow and prosper then it is critical that we efficiently manage our scarce water resources and I am delighted that the Commonwealth has accepted our local proposal for a \$2 billion Australian Water Fund. This proposal was driven by the plan to clean-up Gunnamatta Beach.

The \$2 billion fund will be divided amongst three programs:

- **✓** \$1.6 billion will be dedicated towards water infrastructure across Australia
- \$200 million towards the Raising National Water Standards program and
- \$200 million towards a Water Wise Communities program.

The Water Wise Communities program will allocate of grants \$50,000 to to

## FUNDING FOR LOCAL ENVIRONMENT PROJECTS

I am delighted to announce Commonwealth funding of \$105,972 to help with the conservation of our local environment under the Envirofund scheme and \$228,500 for the Bass Coast Landcare Network.

Seven local landcare groups will benefit from the latest round of funding which is a fantastic result for the local community. New projects include:

- **✔ Koo Wee Rup**, Western Port Swamp Network, \$22,933, Regreening the Koo Wee Rup Swamp
- ✓ Somers, Somers Foreshore Committee of Management, \$15,150, Re-establish Bio-diverse Habitat Corridor on the Eastern Cliffs, Somers
- ✔ Rosebud, Capel Sound Foreshores Committee of Management, \$5,000, Pine Tree Removal and Revegetation
- ✓ Flinders, Friends of Flinders Coastline Inc, \$16,110, Coastal Foreshore Habitat Restoration
- ✔ Phillip Island, Phillip Island Landcare Group Inc, \$23,208, No Weeds Just Wildlife Protecting an Island Habitat
- ✔ Bittern, Friends of Warringine Park Inc, \$12,400, Rehabilitation of Bittern Coastal Wetlands
- ✓ Mt Martha, Balcombe Estuary Rehabilitation Group Inc, \$11,170, Silt Management and Riparian Vegetation Restoration

# HELPING TO BUILD BETTER LOCAL ROADS

As a local who regularly drives throughout the Peninsula, Western Port, Bass Coast and Phillip Island region, I know first hand just how dangerous some of our local roads can be.

And I am working hard with all levels of government – local, state and federal – to build safer roads in our community. In particular I am pleased to announce that thanks to the hard work of many in our local community the following projects have been either announced or delivered through Federal funding:

- Reconstruction and resurfacing of Eramosa Rd West, between Coolart Road and Station Street, Somerville
- ✓ Re-surface Red Hill Road, Red Hill
- ✔ Replacement of Tuerong Road bridge, Moorooduc
- ✓ Resurfacing the whole length of Hotham Road in Sorrento and Portsea
- ✔ Resurfacing of Dromana Parade from Woodlands Grove to Balmoral Avenue, Safety Beach/Dromana
- ✓ Tree removal to improve safety on Dominion Road, Mt Martha
- Resurfacing of Bay Road from Dominion Road to Uralla Road and then Uralla Road, to Nepean Highway, Mt Martha
- ✓ Resurfacing Tubbarubba Road from Myers Road to Balnarring Road in Merricks North
- Repairing and resurfacing Merricks Road from Frankston-Flinders Road to Bittern-Dromana Road
- Reconstruction and resurfacing of Bass, Wood, Esplanade and Cook Streets in Flinders.
- Resurfacing of Melbourne Road in **Rye** and **Blairgowrie** from Dundas Street to Hughes Road and stabilising and

- sealing sections of shoulders.
- ✓ Hardening of shoulders and roundabout on the Hastings-Dandenong and Frankston Flinders Road intersection
- ✓ Improvements to the Bass Highway between **Bass**, **Kilcunda** and **Dalyston**
- ✓ Upgrade of the dangerous intersections of Seven Mile Road and Bunyip River Road in Koo Wee Rup North and Bayles
- Upgrade of Jetty Road and Inglewood Crescent in Rosebud
   South
- ✓ Upgrade of Loders Road Moorooduc including the intersection of Derril, Loders and Bentons Roads
- ✓ Upgrading Bungower Road from Moorooduc Road to Coolart Road, **Moorooduc**
- ✓ Upgrading Barclay Crescent and Bayview Road, Hastings

But I realise that there is **still more to be done** and that is why I am working hard with local, state, and federal governments to fund road projects including:

- ✓ Upgrade the Point Nepean and Truemans Road intersection
- Upgrade the Queens Road and Western Port Highway intersection
- ✓ Seal both Manks Road Clyde and Finsbury Road in Devon Meadows
- ✓ Improve safety on the Clyde-Fiveways Road by widening the road, hardening its shoulders and reducing traffic on the road while upgrading the Koo Wee Rup Pakenham Road to four lanes
- ✔ Upgrade the Fultons Road intersection in Baxter
